Our July 2004 meeting was held at MacBeath Harewood.

Dave Bouwhuis introduced the meeting and discussed having club members do demonstrations at various events as they did at the Brigham City Heritage Arts Festival as mentioned in the last newsletter.

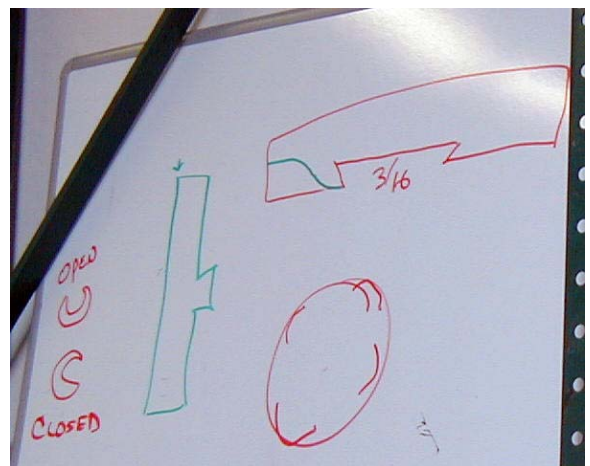
Club President Bob Carter then gave the demonstration.

He showed us how he makes a volcano platter.

He mounted the piece on a screw chuck to true up the block and shape the bottom. He then shaped the bottom of the platter into a wide Ogee Curve (see drawing at right).

He then cut a 3/16" recess in the bottom for mounting on a chuck (see drawing) and then cut the bottom side of the little volcano (see below).

As he contours the top side of the platter he leaves a little post in the middle which he then shapes into a point to represent the top of the volcano (see page 2).
